

SATSUMA CITY COUNCIL

PUBLIC HEARING

October 14, 2008

Mayor Pro Tem Hicks called the Public Hearing to order on Tuesday, October 14 at 6:45 p.m. Members Present: Mayor Pro Tem Hicks, Councilmember Barlow, Councilmember Landrum, Councilmember Phillips and Councilmember Black. Mayor Bush was not present.

Mayor Pro Tem Hicks opened the public hearing and stated that the purpose of the public hearing is to hear comments on the proposed renaming of Williams Avenue to Crook Avenue.

Ms. Elvira Crook Lane came before the Council to request that Williams Avenue be renamed to Crook Avenue. Ms. Lane stated that Willie Crook came as a child to Satsuma and his family owned 10 acres of land on Highway 43 and he did a lot of things for the City. She stated that members of the Crook family still live on the street and they would like to have the street renamed in remembrance of Mr. Crook. She stated that they would like the street to be named Willie Crook Avenue.

Council discussed that a portion of Williams Avenue is in the county and told Ms. Lane that only the portion in the city could be renamed.

Councilmember Barlow asked Mr. Briand if the notice of public hearing was posted. He stated that a sign was placed at the end of Williams Avenue. Councilmember Barlow asked Mr. Briand if he had received any letters or calls of opposition. Mr. Briand stated that he had not.

Mayor Pro Tem Hicks stated there was no opposition either written or verbal..

With no other comments written or expressed Councilmember Landrum made a motion to close the public hearing. Councilmember Barlow seconded the motion and the meeting closed at 6:50.
